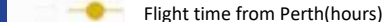
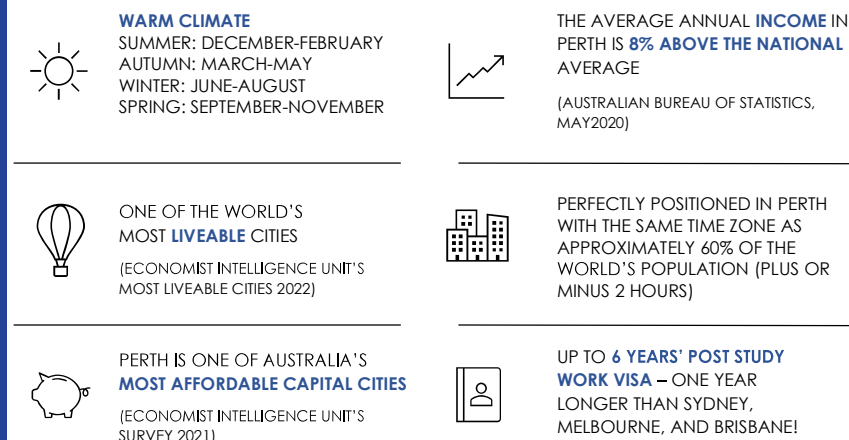

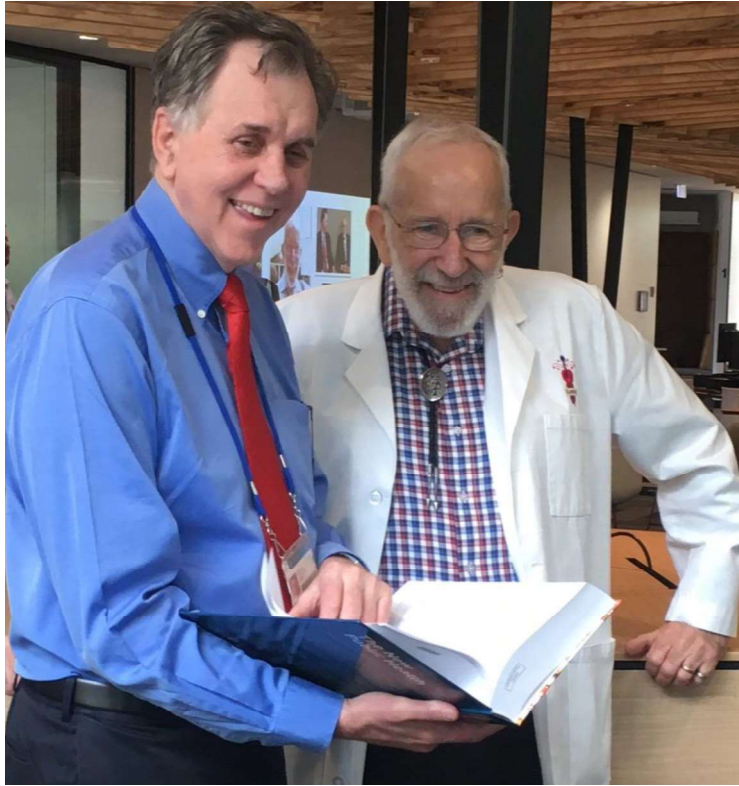

About Barry Marshall

Professor Barry Marshall is a Nobel Laureate, WA Life Science Ambassador, Clinical Professor and Brand Ambassador at The University of Western Australia (UWA).

Professor Marshall (UWA graduate-class of '74), and Emeritus Professor J Robin Warren were awarded the 2005 Nobel Prize for Physiology or Medicine for their discovery of the bacterium *Helicobacter pylori* and its role in gastritis and peptic ulcer disease.

Professor Marshall returned to Perth and UWA in 1996 after a tenure at the University of Virginia. In 1998 Marshall was made a Fellow of the Royal Society. In 2008 he was elected as a Foreign Member of the prestigious US National Academy of Science, an institution that was established in 1863 by President Abraham Lincoln. In 2015 Barry Marshall was awarded the China Friendship Award.

Today, Professor Marshall is the Director of The Marshall Centre for Infectious Diseases Research and Training, founded in his honour.

About Marshall Centre

The Marshall Centre was founded in 2007 to celebrate the awarding of the Nobel Prize in Physiology or Medicine to Professor Barry Marshall and Emeritus Professor Robin Warren.

Origins

Marshall and Warren discovered *H. pylori* and its role as the causative agent of gastritis, peptic and duodenal ulcer disease.

Prior to their work, it was believed that bacteria could not persist in the acid environment of the stomach, and that ulcers were largely due to stress or spicy food.

Leading Infectious Disease Research

Marshall and Warren's discovery was the first step in developing more effective treatments for ulcers and in understanding the causative link between *H. pylori* and stomach cancer.

In addition to *Helicobacter pylori* research, the Marshall Centre is at the forefront of infectious disease identification and surveillance, diagnostics and drug design, as well as transformative discovery. His research has expanded with his group to embrace new technologies including next generation sequencing, and genomic analysis.

Our Research Focus

Our teams focus on three key areas that address major issues facing public health today.

These major issues are:

1. Rapid development of antimicrobial resistance in microbial pathogens and their spread around the world.
2. Emergence of novel pathogens and the requirement for new diagnostic and therapeutic interventions.

Our responses:

1. Identification and tracing: genomics and epidemiology.
2. Reducing time to treatment: novel diagnostic technology.
3. Developing new treatments: novel intervention strategies.
